

It's Bubble Time!

You can use just about anything to make a bubble wand, but start with these ideas and experiment later.

Plastic cup:

Punch a hole in the bottom to blow through.
Dip the large open end into the solution and blow.

Plastic soft drink bottles:

Cut the bottom off the bottle and dip.
Use the lid end of the bottle to blow you bubbles.

Plastic funnel:

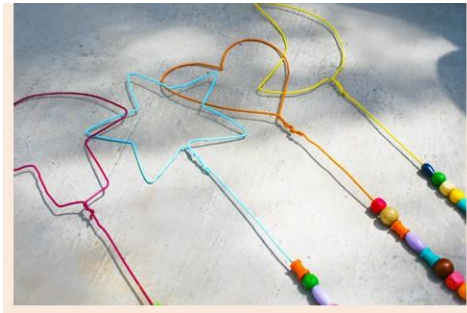
This already has a natural shape for a bubble wand.
Using the large end to dip and the small end to blow,
this is a sure winner!

Drinking straws:

These should be small, but fast flowing bubbles.
Why not bunch some together and see how many you can get. Dip and try!

TIC-TAC-TOE...THREE IN A ROW!

Using the plastic lids for playing pieces, have a rousing game of tic-tac-toe. Here are some fun ideas on making a grid.

1. Painter's tape – this can easily be applied to the side of a shed, camper or building. If the tape is placed on metal, you can add magnets to the back of each lid for a great magnetic game – *you'll need to stick two magnets (one on top of the other) on each lid for them to work.*
2. Yard style – using spray paint, paint the grid work on the lawn. You can easily add more grids to incorporate a larger group of children. In a week...mow off the grids! Nothing left behind 😊
3. Sticks and twigs – Gather fallen sticks or twigs to lay on the ground for the grid work. This would work well if you were camping or in a park.
4. Fabric/plastic grid work – Want to play the game standing up? Cut a piece out of an old sheet or shower curtain and draw the grid lines on with a marker. Using sticky Velcro, add a piece of loopy Velcro to each of the grid squares and the matching piece to the back side of each of the plastic lids. Hang the grid on the wall for a fun game of tic-tac-toe.
